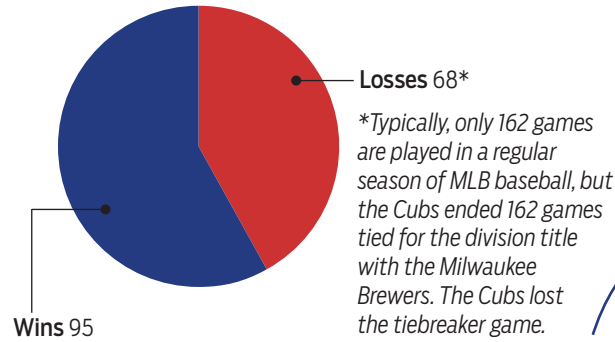


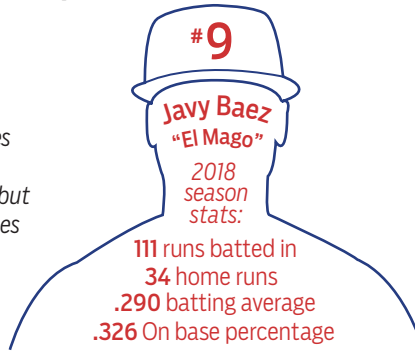
They tried (and failed) not to suck

For the first time in franchise history, the Chicago Cubs made it to the postseason four years in a row. The 2016 World Series Champions struggled this 2018 season with injuries and long periods without a break. The Cubs held first place in the National League Central Division from July 13, when they tied the Milwaukee Brewers, to Oct. 1 when they lost to them in the tie-breaking, 163rd game. The Cubs then fell to the Colorado Rockies 2-1 in the wild-card game to end their season. Many questioned where the season went wrong and pointed to the offense as a reason.

REGULAR SEASON BREAKDOWN

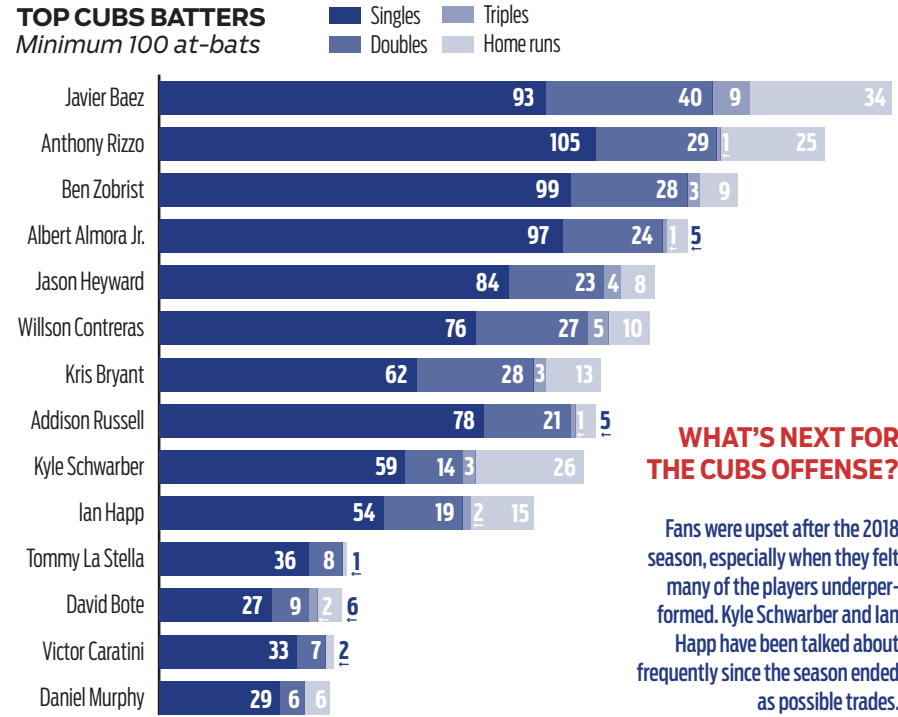
